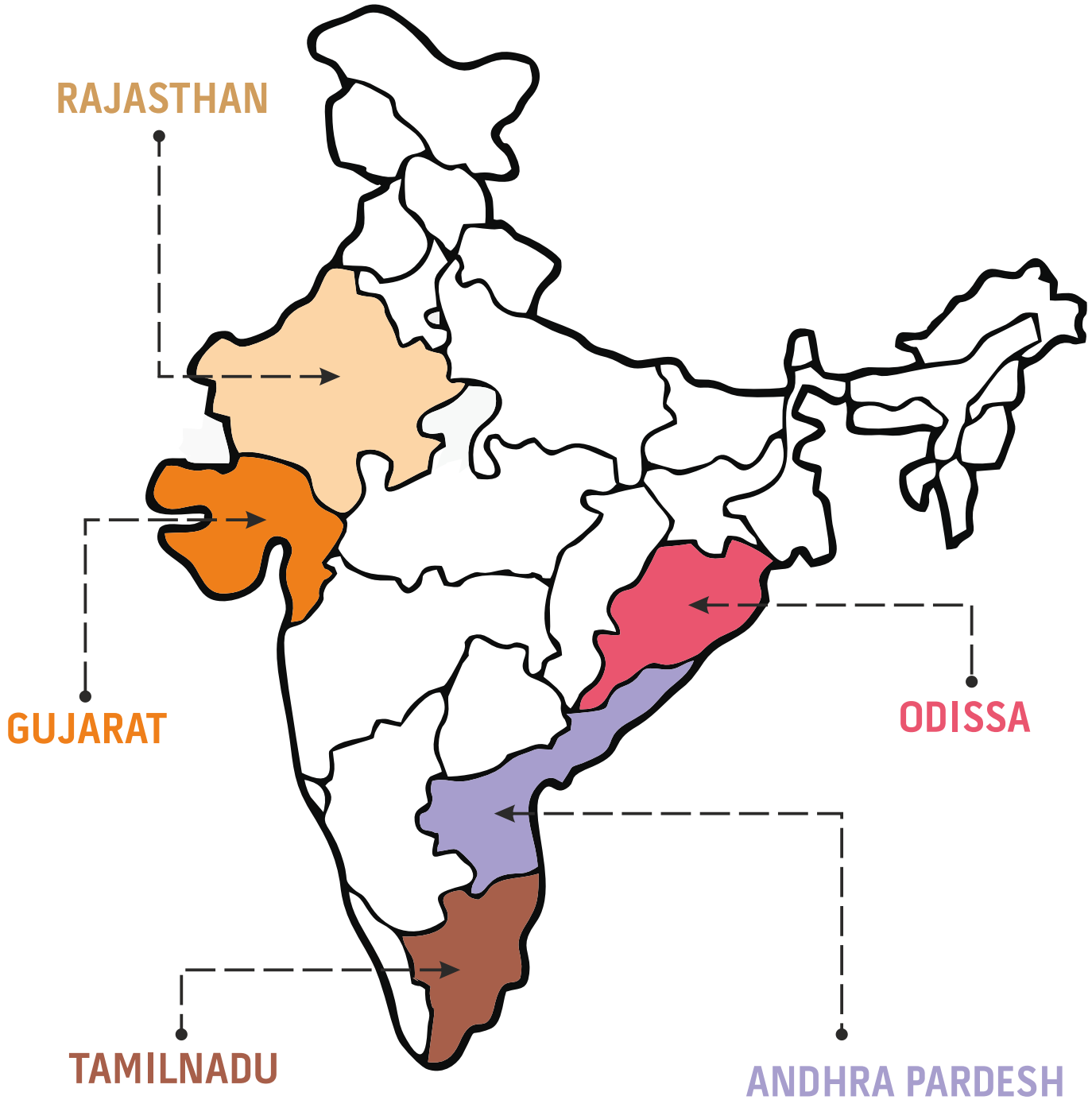

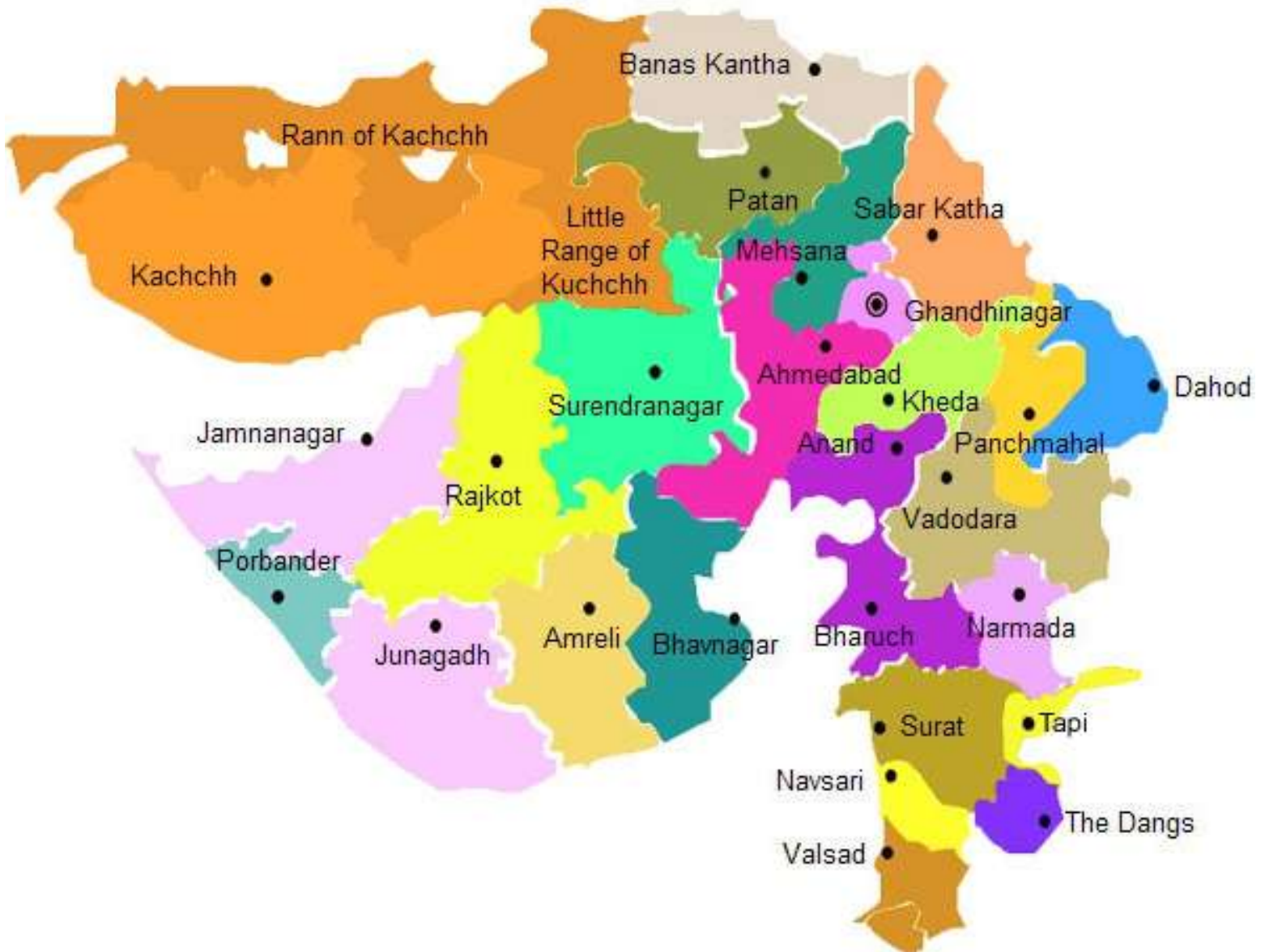

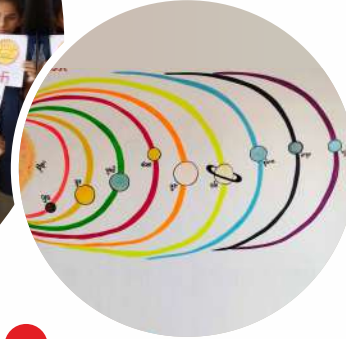

SUCCESS STORIES

Tejal is a third-grade kid whose mother died a long time ago. She resides with her grandma and father. She wasn't a regular student and was afraid to approach the teacher. She had trouble at school, and some have described her behaviour as nasty. She was only in third grade, but she was unable to even recognize numerals from 1 to 10. Not even the alphabet were recognized by her. She disliked attending school. She did not pay much attention to her because her father was a laborer, and because she was with her grandma, Since the start of the school year, Tejal missed two consecutive months of attendance. CF and Vidhyasathi chose to meet her Grandmother. She and her grandmother were convinced to enroll Tejal in a regular school when they paid her a visit. She began going to school frequently. One day she entered in the classroom & remained silent and did not contribute to anything. Then VidhyaSaathi handed her a set of colourful stones to play with because she knew from observation that the teacher would comprehend her and what she would be interested in. He cherished using stones for play. She was slowly introduced to the game as it was being played.

She is relatively confident and unafraid to ask questions. Additionally, she always shows up to class prepared to learn something new. Tejal feels confident and motivated to attend class and school on a regular basis as learning is taking place right now without any further guidance.





ASANI UNIT



The Asani sanitary napkins manufacturing unit being one of its kind in the entire tribal district of Bharuch and Narmada, fully managed by women. Intensive capacity building and training of these women who had hardly completed their formal primary education, have led them to form a successful entrepreneurial group of 11 members – cooperating not just for their social and familial matters but more importantly taking concrete steps towards accessibility and ownership of financial resources, availing banking facilities and thereby gaining empowerment.



MENSTRUAL HYGIENE MANAGEMENT

To secure the right to health in general and right to reproductive health for women in particular also to affect a socio-behavioural change in knowledge, attitudes and practices pertaining to menstruation among population at large.



HEALTH CAMP

To provide free medical advice, medicines to the underprivileged people and refer for specialized treatment or surgery whatever is required. These camps make sure people are getting healthcare at the right time, and getting the consultation early enough before a small health problem turns serious.



SUCCESS STORIES

Ritaben Parmar resides in Sanjali village of Ankleshwar block with her family. She has studied upto 10th standard and is very much interested to learn new things. Her husband is a daily wage earner and daughter is of 15 years age. The financial condition of the family is not good. Field Officer in the GVT - GCL project were did an MHM in that village. Rita Parmar helped a lot for organising the meeting and held the same at her residence itself. All the women present were made aware about various aspects of MHM and also were informed about the quality of Asani sanitary napkins alongwith a demonstration. GCL intervention gradually affects behaviour modification towards safe menstrual hygiene practices and it is with that objective that Asani pads were offered at affordable price. She expressed interest for buying the pads after a few interactions and one to one discussions and gradually shifted to the use of Asani sanitary pads. Later on she took 10 small packs and expressed interest to become a sangini. The field officer trained her in social marketing, counselling, MHM and creating a network. She became the role model for other women of the village and effectively convinces them by explaining her own example towards using Asani pads. Within a span of 2 months she increased the sale from 10 packs to 50 packs and now she visits nearby faliya also for selling the same. She sold more than 200 packs by the end of one months and is very happy with the work. The income she has been able to achieve as sangini is being used by her for the education of her child as well as to provide for other facilities at her home. She is very much satisfied with the work.

SUCCESS STORIES

This success story is about a pregnant woman named, Pallavi Ajay Patel who is 7 month pregnant lives in Juna Diva 2, age 27 years old. She was having very less weight and HB in her first trimester i.e. 45 kg and 10.5 grams per decilitre.

GVT's outreach worker started visiting her every month and gave her counselling about having healthy food such as protein, vitamins, healthy fats, fruits and vegetables and also gave her counselling about the Take Home Ration (THR) packets to consume regularly by making loaf that they eat daily with cooked vegetables and I counselled her how she can make different dishes out of the THR packets and some of them are pudding, sukhi, fist shape dumpling (muthia), flatbread etc.

As per the counselling, Pallavi started consuming THR the way outreach worker explained and also started consuming healthy food regularly and it is noticed that her weight got increased from 45 to 50 kgs in under 7 months and her haemoglobin got improved from 10.5 to 10.8 grams per decilitre till date.





SEWING TRAINING



Our sewing training program offers comprehensive instruction and hands-on experience to equip participants with the skills and knowledge necessary to excel in the world of sewing. From learning the fundamentals of stitching and fabric selection to mastering advanced techniques, our program covers a wide range of topics. In 2022-2023, 15 batches has been conducted in which 350+ beneficiaries has been trained.

BEAUTICIAN TRAINING



Our beautician training program is designed to empower individuals with the knowledge and practical skills needed to thrive in the beauty industry. Covering a wide range of topics such as skincare, makeup application, hair styling, and spa treatments, our comprehensive curriculum prepares students for a successful career as a professional beautician. In 2022-2023, 12 batches has been conducted in which 335+ beneficiaries has been trained.

COMPUTER TRAINING



Our computer training program offers comprehensive instruction and hands-on experience to equip participants with essential computer skills and knowledge. From basic computer literacy to advanced topics such as programming, web development, and data analysis, our program caters to learners of all levels, whether they are beginners or experienced professionals.

In 2022-2023, 08 batches has been conducted in which 170+ beneficiaries has been trained.

From day one, Mrs. Vasava exhibited unwavering commitment to his studies. Despite facing financial constraints and the need to travel to the training center, he never missed a class. He was often seen studying diligently, practicing his typing skills, mastering software applications, and grasping the fundamentals of computer operations.

Learning computer skills wasn't without its challenges. The concepts were new to Mrs. Vasava, and at times he felt overwhelmed. However, his determination, coupled with the support of his trainers and peers, helped him overcome these obstacles. CHILDREN'S REHABILITATION

These centres offer a range of interventions, therapies, and support services tailored to meet the unique needs of each child.

CHILDREN'S REACHED AND ASSISTED

SUCCESS STORIES

In the town of Bharuch, a small incident at the railway station caught the attention of the Gujarat Railway Police. Seventeen-year-old Suraj Kumar, caught red-handed, was attempting to steal a phone. However, the authorities saw not just a criminal act, but an opportunity for redemption. They sought the assistance of Childline 1098, an organization known for its dedication to rescuing and counselling vulnerable children.

Childline member was assigned to Suraj Kumar's case. With empathy and understanding, she approached the local police station. There, she met a dishevelled and frightened Suraj. Sitting across from him, she could sense the fear and confusion in his eyes. She introduced herself as a friend, not an authority figure, and began the process of building trust. Suraj hesitated initially, but gradually began to open up. He shared his story of growing up in a challenging environment - a broken family, financial struggles, and peer pressure. Member listened carefully, refraining from judgment. She understood that Suraj's actions were a result of circumstances beyond his control.

Childline team member introduced Suraj to the idea of choices. She gently explained that while his past might have influenced his actions, he still had the power to shape his future. She painted a picture of possibilities - education, skills, and a life away from crime.

Suraj Kumar's story, once marked by desperation and wrongdoing, was now a testament to the power of compassion, guidance, and a second chance. Through the unwavering support of Childline and the dedication of Team members, a young life had been rescued from the clutches of darkness. Suraj's journey wasn't just one of redemption; it was a story of transformation that echoed the potential for change in every child, no matter how lost they may seem.
